

The food was amazing and cheap. About 7 or 8 Australian Dollars for a meal including 3 or 4 drinks.

There was much learned about the culture from the wet markets to farming practices, arts and crafts, and a human circus to boot.

The 16 members of the trip had the most amazing experiences, thanks to Brian and Sue and their relationships with the locals. Next trip after xmas Dec 2025!
