RYPEN (Rotary Youth Program of Enrichment) is open to students aged 13 - 17 years. "The Leadership team consists of Rotaract and RYLA volunteers who each bring a unique set of skills and experience. The program is run over 2 days commencing on a Saturday afternoon and finishing on Monday afternoon. It offers a variety of activities that allow participants to increase their knowledge and improve their skills in leadership, team building, problem solving and creative thinking. Participants also learn about understanding others. These sessions are balanced with games and outdoor challenges that provide the opportunity to practise new skills. All sessions are done working in teams with an assigned leader from the leadership team." Next RYPEN program will be held 7-9 June at Bonny Hills
