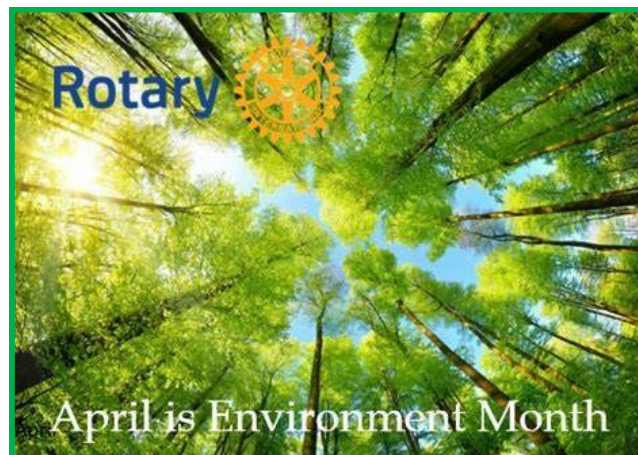

Rowan served in Middle East in 2012, returning there in 2017. He trained along with personnel from 16 other nations.

Rowan was Officer Commander of Joint Movement and particularly enjoyed organizing supplies and donations to Ukraine.

He is now a Joint Operational Training teacher, working towards outcomes, despite government policies.

GUEST SPEAKERS

Club Member, **Colonel Eric Modderman**, introduced the ANZAC Guest Speakers. Each speaker was asked to inform about aspects of their service, as well the meaning of ANZAC Day for them.

Commander David Crane, RAN

HMAS Anzac (FFH 150) was the leadship of the Anzac Class frigates in use with the Royal Australian Navy and the Royal New Zealand Navy. Entering Australian service in 1996, the frigate operated as part of the INTER-FET peacekeeping taskforce in 1999. In 2003, she was involved in the battle of Al Faw, and became the first RAN ship to fire in anger since the Vietnam War.

David explained the operations and capabilities of HMAS Anzac, including an excerpt from the ship's log that included firing action.

ANZAC DAY - 'duty and professionalism'

Warrant Officer Class 1 Les Hart - Army

Les joined the Army in 1984, and retires on ANZAC Day. He has been a machine gunner and marksman. He emphasised the importance of family to him. Les had had 13 postings, 10 years in the Hunter Valley. He has enjoyed interacting with Service personnel from different countries.

Les has had 4 commanding teaching postings, during which time he has formed lasting, unbreakable friendship bonds and he connects with Army friends from over 40 years through Facebook.

Julie Dixon thanked Eric for his organisation and the speakers for their sharing of insights from the heart.

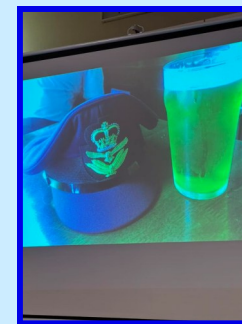
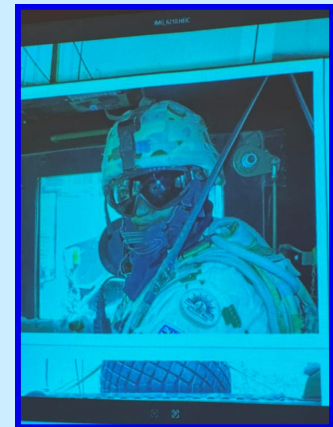
